Questions to Identify the Best In-Home Care Agencies

Here are some questions to ask:

- Is the company licensed by the State, bonded, and insured?
- It should be. Be very careful if not.
- Are all caregivers employees, not contracted labor?

Companies with caregivers as employees pay all of the necessary taxes and typically provide a higher quality service because they have the best caregivers. You should also make sure the agency you choose does not pay their caregivers minimum wage, which normally equals minimum quality.

- When and how often are thorough background check performed?
- The Department of Human Services requires all licensed agencies to perform background checks on all caregivers before they meet with clients. The best agencies have a policy to perform these checks on an ongoing basis.
- If I have a question/concern/issue who can I speak with about it?

You should be able to speak with the owner. The owner is ultimately responsible for all activities at the agency and you deserve access when/if you need it.

- If the company offers transportation, what type of insurance do they carry?
- You want to make sure the company carries "hired, non-owned" automobile coverage. This provides the maximum protection for you and the employee. Standard employee owned automobile insurance and general liability does not provide you the proper protection. Get a copy of proof of coverage for "hired non-owned" automobile coverage from the agency you choose.
- Are you locally owned and operated? How long have you been in business?

Big, national companies are putting franchises everywhere. This is not always bad, but you have probably visited different locations of the same fast food restaurant and have seen a huge difference in service and quality. The standard is not very high to open an in-home care franchise and unfortunately without a passionate owner you may be leaving the service and quality to chance —while you are just buying the big name. Providing great service and quality is not as easy as most think it is and you should make sure the company you choose has been in business at least for at least 10 years.
